SEMINAR DETAILS

Friday March 14th

12 PM – 4PM: Cues/Cues; Develop and enrich your handling cues. Cue training will include jumping, tunnel, deceleration Session will teach your dog to use them and you to apply them in sequence situations. Types will include but not limited to cueing backsides, wraps, tunnel turns, jumps tight turns or wider, decels to other obstacles.

5PM – **7PM: Puppy Foundation skills -**Foundation skills to build that young puppy into a future agility dog. Jumping, contacts training, recalls, etc. all things to develop for the puppy. Cost is $\frac{1}{2}$ of the full session shown below.

Saturday March 15th

8AM – 12PM : Young dog seminar – Young dogs skills and drills . Theresa's choice of handling sequences , no contacts or weaves .Just tunnels and jumps . Probably should be at least a year old but plenty of hard work in there for even excellent level dogs , Great for speeding up unconfident dogs or just good work on how to keep up with those speedy dogs!

1:00PM – 5PM – Advanced handling- designed for teams that want to improve longer sequences and full courses. This will include early blinds, wraps, threadle wraps, threadle slices, layering, backsides, flips, and more. Be prepared to learn distance or use distance skills if you have them. This is challenging but a whole lot of fun. AFrame and weaves will be used. Expand on the skills learned in November. Additionally adding skills to help with Premier

Sunday March 16th

8AM – 12PM: Basic Course work All levels Designed for young dogs that need to enhance their skills at the upper levels. Increase the use of different strategies to create winning situations on the course. Could include distance, new skills or new uses of the skills the team already knows. Teams need to run excellent/master level courses

1:00pm – 5:00 PM – Handling & Sequences; Handlers looking to smooth out their sequences and handling. This will include blinds, backsides and threadles along with rear and front crosses. Depending on the need, focus could be on use of more blinds. A Frame contact & weaves will be used.
